All are welcome to attend the meeting which will be held in the Village Hall on Thursday 6 April at 7.30 pm.



The parish gets a share of money paid to Babergh District Council for building development in Bentley, **Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL)**, to spend on parish infrastructure.

When we did the Neighbourhood Plan consultation in 2018, we asked how you would like the village facilities developed.

You told us that these were your priorities:



What we've done:

Road safety – we've bought two Speed Indicator Signs, and persuaded Suffolk CC to put us on the rota of villages visited by the Automatic Number Plate Recognition speed cameras. The Parish Council took advantage of a county wide Quiet Lanes scheme to have several of our own.

Wildlife – we designated all the green spaces in the village in the Neighbourhood Plan, meaning that they can't be built on, including the Copse along Capel Rd.

Playground – we put in the gym equipment on the Playing Field, along with the picnic benches, and put in drainage across the field to make it much more playable year-round. We added an upcycled slide/climbing frame to the Play Area (thanks to Mark Woods and Ray Bloomfield).

Land for public use – thanks to Sandra Bond's generosity, we now have the Community Orchard.

Recreation facilities – we have replaced several of the village benches and added new. The War Memorial area is getting an upgrade, with a beautiful commemorative bench.

On current development plans, we should get around £38,000 up to 2030. We need to update the Parish Infrastructure Improvement Plan that formed part of the Neighbourhood Plan. To do that we need to know -

BENTLEY WILDLIFE NOTES

Bentley's Ancient Woodland

England's woodlands have arrived following the retreat of the Arctic landscape of the last Ice Age, some 12,000 years ago, with a succession of tree species re-colonising the landscape. Repopulation of the landscape by men began about 6,000 years ago, and woodlands were exploited for agriculture, building and as a fuel resource. Some of the woodland on better soils was cleared for agriculture. The woodland on poorer soils tended to remain but was also used for feeding pigs. Growth and spread was checked by grazing animals, including introduced animals such as Rabbits and Fallow deer. It is likely that all current woodland has been modified by human use, but certain woodland has remained constantly wooded for many centuries and has consequently developed a special and diverse ecology and great importance as a heritage asset. Ancient woodland has been defined as woodland that has persisted on record or maps since 1600. As of now only 2.5% of UK land area is covered by ancient woodland.


While the village name Bentley suggests a grassed (Bent) clearing (ley), the inventory of Suffolk Ancient woodland lists Brockley Wood, Old Hall Wood, Long Wood and Engry Wood as ancient woodland in Bentley. The woods of Bentley are mentioned in the Domesday book (and which could sustain 12 pigs!)

There are various ecological markers that denote ancient woodland, apart from vintage native trees, and specific tree—species such as Wild service, and Small-leaved lime. Flowering plant species such as English Bluebells, Wood anemone, Dogs mercury, Red campion, and Primrose – all of which are present and particularly Bluebells and Wood anemone are prolific in our woods. The diversity of the ecology of an old woodland allows a great diversity of insect, mammal and bird species to maintain a toehold in the environment. A special creature, particularly found in our woods, is the endangered Hazel dormouse, as so beautifully filmed in the current BBC Wild Isles series.

On this map from 1837, Brockley Wood is included in Old Hall Wood. The woods are now divided and reduced. The land cleared between them is the current application site for the gravel pit and waste and concrete processing plant.

While some ancient woodland has been replanted with not-native trees, if left to their own devices, the woodland could and should be encouraged to return to its native character, and we should do all we can to prevent further attrition of this beautiful resource. **Michael Bamford**

Return of the Polecat

It has been exciting to see the polecats gradual return to Suffolk since their demise in the early 1900's. A member of the mustelid family this carnivore is a distant "cousin" to the domestic ferret, this makes identification of polecats difficult to determine against released domestic ferrets. It has been suggested however that polecat characteristics are potentially dominant over ferret characteristics giving reassurance that any hybridisation should not affect the polecat population, this is not to condone the release of any ferrets however. Continued overleaf..

My recent university project has involved mobilising over 30 camera traps at three sites across Suffolk with the help of my course leader and a few peers. All cameras were placed 50cm above the ground in a regular orientation in the hope to catch the most variety of mammals. It has been exciting to capture one shot of what I hope is a polecat and not a released ferret. (See the shining eyes in the clip from the video below.)

Their return to the area has been largely documented especially with the Suffolk Biodiversity Information Service (SBIS) recording service. It is however always thrilling to get a glimpse of such an elusive creature even if it is just on camera. This project that I am undertaking with the university of Suffolk is in conjunction with Snapshot Europe and it is hoped once all the data has been analysed that a deeper understanding of mammal movement, behaviour and species richness can be determined.

Keep an eye out for polecats as they could soon be present in the village if not already. Do check out the Suffolk Biodiversity Information Service - https://www.suffolkbis.org.uk/record and report your sightings (including roadkill) to help with monitoring. Most species can be recorded here.



From District Councillor David Busby

For the local council elections on 4TH MAY (and all subsequent elections) the rules in relation to VOTER IDENTIFICATION (ID) will change. Please note the following important changes:

- ➤ To vote in person at your local polling station you will need to present photographic identification (such as a Passport or Driving Licence) in order to cast your vote. Please see details below on how to obtain this if you do not already have any.
- ➤ If you plan to vote via a postal vote (PV), you do not need photographic identification (ID). If you aren't a POSTAL VOTER, why not become one? It is quick and easy to register, and means that from this election forwards, you can remain registered, and will simply need to fill in your choice of candidate, at both local and general elections.
