
The new term starts in September when we will be welcoming our new intake of reception children. We will be planning lots more sporting events and activities in school in the new term.

WILDLIFE NOTES

Bentley's Ancient Woodland: Dodnash Wood - a history

Dodnash Wood seems to be a remnant of a much larger wood illustrated in that is Domesday Book of 1086 [Suffolk woodland 1086 map]. Details of its past can be found in the research carried out by Cambridge scholar the Professor Oliver Rackham who Dodnash surveyed when writing his book Ancient Woodland: history, its vegetation and uses in England. Records of its history include a map of 1629 that shows 'two great ashes' in the wood. An 18th century survey of woods, mainly in Suffolk and Essex, show that a quite large wood might be felled, as was Dodnash Wood in 1663, 1740 and 1761. Records also show that the biggest oaks (205



trees) from this wood were sold in 1760, and a cherry tree and wild service tree sold in 1809. Rackham's map of Suffolk parishes illustrates the distribution of late medieval woodland as it was after 1350 when Bentley had some eight medieval woods, five of which were more or less intact and three that were damaged, e.g. by replanting (although in Dodnash Wood the traditional management by coppicing continued after planting sweet chestnut).

Today, Dodnash Wood with its introduced, non-native sweet chestnut trees does not appear to be ancient. For many years it has been managed as sweet chestnut coppice, though coppicing these trees ceased some time ago as shown by the very large multiple trunks that have grown from their massive stools (the bases of the original coppiced trees) [photo]. The more recent planting of conifers, birch and sweet chestnut add to the wood's non-ancient appearance. Nevertheless, clues to its age are revealed by its bank and ditch which date it back to the medieval period. Further clues are revealed with the emergence of its spring ancient flora and the presence of wild service trees. Botanical surveys of Dodnash Wood have been carried out many times by the author and at least once by the Recorder members of the Suffolk Naturalists' Society.

WILDLIFE NOTES

We know that wood anemones, bluebells, dog's mercury, brambles, and other woodland flora go back to prehistoric times. Plants that are indicators of ancient woodland and Dodnash Wood's ancient origin are: first and foremost the presence of wood anemone clones (all genetically identical), closely followed by dog's mercury, bluebell, wild service tree and others including butcher's broom.

Mention must also be made of the ancient woodland, rare hazel dormouse that is present in Dodnash Wood; this threatened mammal species is protected under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended) but has declined in the UK by nearly 50% in the last 10 years.

But things will certainly be a little different in this council term. No party won an overall majority in the recent local elections – as has often been the case in our district - but the Green, Independent and Liberal Democrat groups have since agreed to form a coalition.

I am leader this year representing the Liberal Democrats, Cllr Deborah Saw will lead years two and four for the Green Party (who won the most seats in the elections), and Cllr John Ward will lead the third year for the Independents.

We don't have huge reserves to help us deliver solutions, but we do have a great team of officers and an administration that is ambitious, creative and wants to make good things happen.

We'll be outlining our plans as soon as we can, and I look forward to keeping you updated, but the big emphasis from me, for now, is about working together. For us to succeed, we will all need to work together – the politicians, our council workforce, and our communities. Collectively we can make a real impact, and make our district even better.

I hope to speak to many of you in the weeks and months ahead, to hear your views and see how we can address the issues that matter to you. I very much look forward to seeing what we can all achieve in the next four years.

It's a proud moment for me to lead Babergh Council, and alongside my colleagues, I am excited to get this new chapter for our district started.
